THE WARSAW EAST EUROPEAN CONFERENCE will be held under the distinguished patronage of the Rector Magnificus of Warsaw University, Professor Katarzyna Chałasińska Macukow.

THE MAIN SUBJECTS of the Warsaw East European Conference, Fourth Annual Session, are democratic and authoritarian tendencies in East Central, South East and Eastern Europe since 18th century. The Conference will focus on history of 19th and 20th centuries as well as current political, social, economic, national and cultural issues related to the main subject. Special attention will be given to the problems of the communist and post-communist world. Therefore, the Caucasus and Central Asian issues will be also relevant for the WEEC, FourthAnnual Session. - The citizen and the state. Changing notions of citizenship
- Local democracies and the civil society construction
- The role of NGOs in the post-communist and post-Soviet countries
- Between the nation-state and empire in post-Soviet area
- Imperial revival in 21st century Russia?
- Putin's domestic and foreign policy and its consequences
- Baltic States and Russia: neighbourhood and conflict
- EU's Eastern policy
- EU Turkey relations. The future of Muslim democracy: inside or outside of the EU?
- EU Russia relations. Russian policy towards EU members
- Energy security
- New EU members: Bulgaria and Romania
- EU's policy towards the Black Sea region
- Nationality problems in East Central and Southern Europe, Caucasus and Central Asia
- Unstable regions and frozen conflicts in post-communist and post-Soviet area (Kosovo, Transdnestria, Chechnya, Abkhazia, Southern Ossetia, Mountainous Karabakh, etc.)
- Nation-state building processes in Central Asia
- Transcaucasia difficult way towards democracy?

These are the topics, which are going to be discussed during the WEEC, Fourth Annual Session. Nevertheless, we will also accept other subjects of presentation related to the main issue of the Conference.

CONFERENCE organizers invite submissions of recent documentaries or feature films available in video (VHS or DVD) format. The videos selected for the conference will be screened during regular panel slots and will be followed by a discussion moderated by academic experts.

THE CONFERENCE will be held at the Warsaw University main campus in the centre of Warsaw, at Krakowskie Przedmieście Street.

THE CONFERENCE will begin on Sunday, July 15 at 4 PM, and end on Wednesday, July 18 at 6 PM, 2007.
