The Centre for East European Studies of the University of Warsaw (STUDIUM EUROPY WSCHODNIEJ UW) is organizing the WARSAW EAST EUROPEAN CONFERENCE, Sixth Annual Session, to be held in Warsaw, July 15-18, 2009.

THE WARSAW EAST EUROPEAN CONFERENCE will be held under the distinguished patronage of the Rector Magnificus of the University of Warsaw, Professor Katarzyna Chałasińska-Macukow.

THE MAIN SUBJECT of the Sixth Warsaw East European Conference is the road of the East Central Europe from totalitarian regimes to independence in the XXth century. The conference will focus on three essential dates in the history and contemporary situation in Europe: 1939-1989-2009. Changes in East-Central Europe will be discussed with focus on political, social, economic and cultural issues.

THE PAPER PROPOSALS, full papers and their abstracts must be written in English. However, in exceptional cases, the Conference organizers will allow some presentations in the panels to be delivered in Polish, on condition that a comprehensive written summary or the entire text in English is made available to the audience and the organizers. Also the organizers have to be informed earlier (no less than 1 month in advance).

## PANEL PROPOSAL

Panels may be proposed under these conditions:

1. the theme of the panel has to reflect the main theme of the Conference,
2. the applicant proposing the panel must guarantee 3 - 4 participants,
3. the applicant or one of the participants has to be the Chair of the proposed panel.

Furthermore, if the conditions are fulfilled, a discussant can also be assigned to the panel.

## PAYMENTS

ALL PARTICIPANTS of the WEEC are obliged to pay the registration fee. Speakers must pay the fee at least one month in advance, until June 15, 2009. Listeners may pay on the first day of the conference.

There are two ways to pay the fee:

1. Send the fee by regular money transfer
2. To avoid money transfer costs, participants may insert their credit card information (Internet Registration System- "Finances") the registration fee will be transferred from your bank account by the University of Warsaw accountancy, with no additional charges.

Participants (speakers) who will fail to pay the registration fee by the **15<sup>th</sup> of June, 2009** will be removed from the list of participants as speakers and will only be able to attend the conference as listeners.

This is to ensure that a maximum number of speakers will be coming to the conference in July hence to avoid mistakes in conference programme.

## FUNDING

PARTICIPANTS of the WEEC 2009 are responsible for covering all travel and accommodation costs. However, **registered** participants, chairs and discussants will be offered **free accommodation** in University student hostels, double rooms.

Furthermore, help is offered with making reservations in hotels with which certain prices have been arranged for the participants of the WEEC Conference.
