

The Centre for East European Studies of the University of Warsaw (STUDIUM EUROPY WSCHODNIEJ UW) is organizing the WARSAW EAST EUROPEAN CONFERENCE, the Fifth Anniversary Session, to be held in Warsaw, July 15-18, 2008.

THE WARSAW EAST EUROPEAN CONFERENCE will be held under the distinguished patronage of the Rector Magnificus of the University of Warsaw, Professor Katarzyna Chałasińska - Macukow.

THE MAIN SUBJECT of the Warsaw East European Conference, Fifth Annual Session is question of freedom and power in East Central, South East and Eastern Europe, Russia, Central Asia and Caucasus since 18th century. The Conference will focus on history of 19th and 20th centuries as well as current political, social, economic, national and cultural issues broadly reflecting the main subject. Special attention will be given to the problems of the communist and post-communist world.

- 3. one of the participants has to be the Chair of the proposed panel.

Furthermore, if the conditions are fulfilled we can also assign a discussant to the panel.




